DR. ROBERT GIUGLIANO is a cardiovascular medicine specialist at Brigham and Women's Hospital and an associate professor of medicine at Harvard Medical School. In addition, he is a senior investigator of BWH's Thrombolysis in Myocardial Infarction (TIMI) Study Group. His research focuses on novel antithrombotic agents and lipid-lowering therapies to prevent myocardial infarction and stroke.
